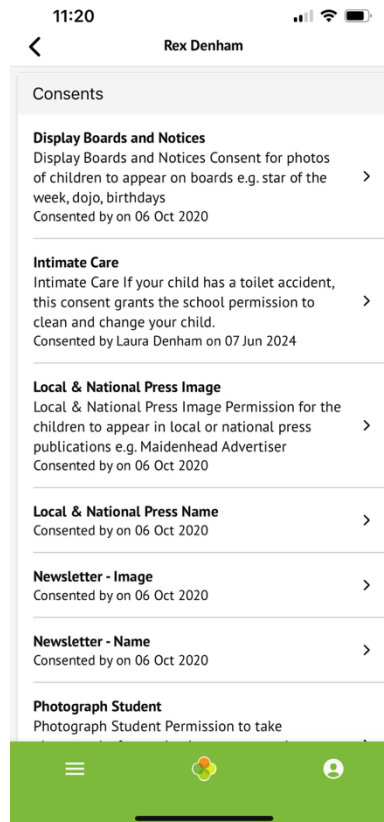
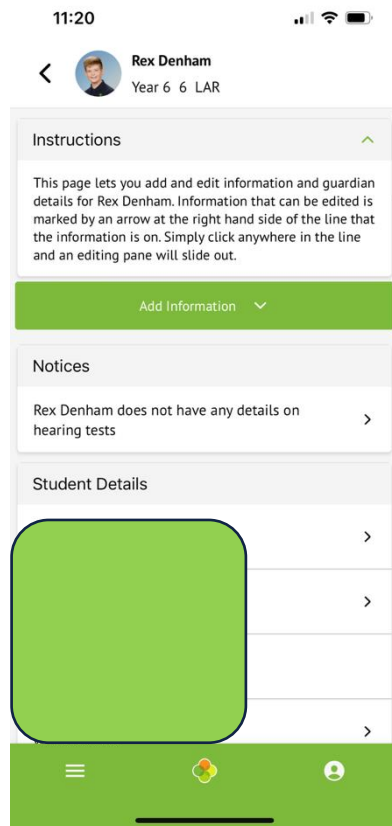
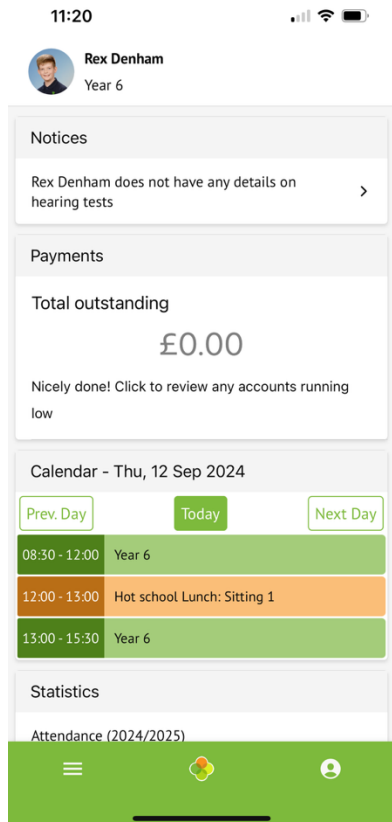

Attendance

Being in school is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development.

- Regular attendance and punctuality is really important.
- Odd days off have a huge impact on children's learning and progress as well as socially.
- Being on time sets the tone for the day and ensures no learning is missed.
- No holidays will be authorised.
- Local authority are monitoring attendance through Educational Welfare Officers (EWO)
- Sickness bugs - 48-hour rule
- Medication in school- should be prescribed by the doctor and in original packaging. Complete 'request for administration of medicine' form.



Parking

- School car park is not to be used by parents at any time – including breakfast and after school club
- In the morning, please do not park on the roadside. This slows down Kiss and Drop system. Parking is available at the Beehive or in Parish Car Park.
- Please do not park on pavements during collection. This is preventing those with buggies to use the footpath safely.
- Please do not block driveways or garages.
- Do not park on corner of Innings Lane.

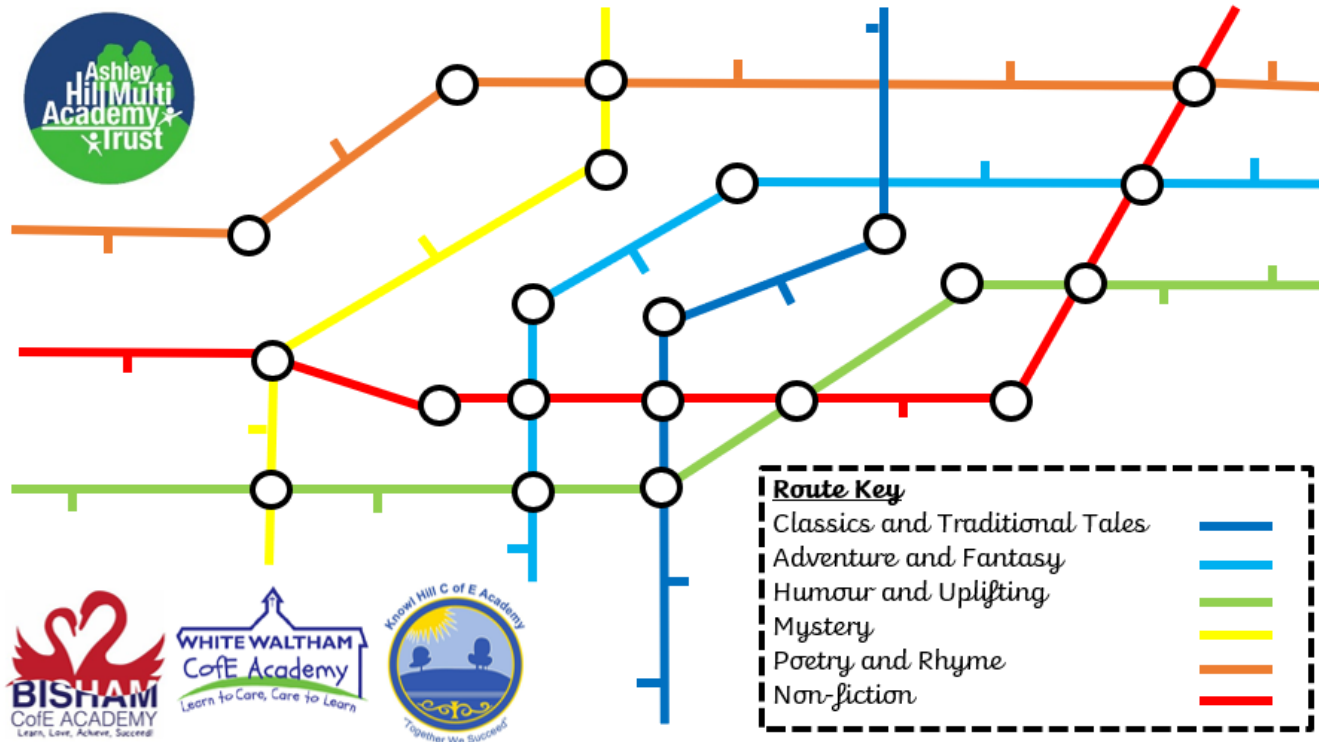


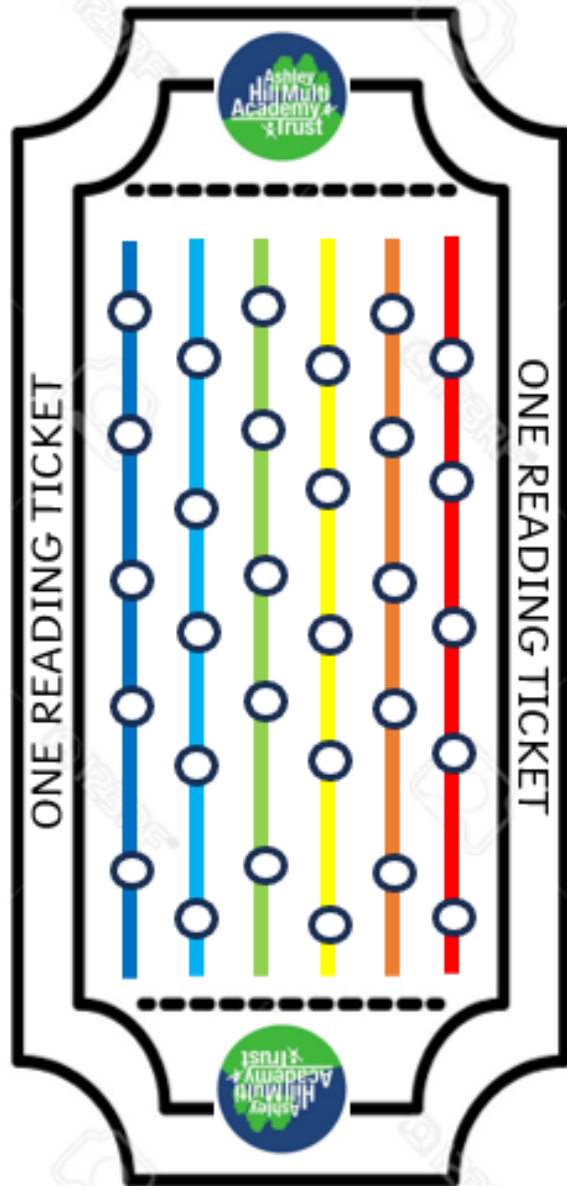
Reading

Reading

- Our 'reading routes' challenge is inspired by the underground and making journeys to read books across a range of genres. Each coloured line on the reading routes map corresponds to a different genre. At school, we have shelves stocked with specially selected books for pupils to loan out and begin reading. When each pupil has read a book, this must be written in their reading record and they will have their reading routes ticket 'punched' when the book is completed, just like a real train ticket! If a pupil has a book they would particularly like to read from outside of school, this can also be matched up to a genre and will contribute towards the challenge.





Reading

Pupils can choose to read across the genres, to complete a whole line and to complete their whole ticket. There will be prizes for reading...

Incentives



- Reading one book from each genre – children will receive a certificate, celebrated in our Celebration Assembly.
- Completing one full genre line – children will receive a certificate, celebrated in our Celebration Assembly.
- Completing the full Reading Routes ticket by reading across all genres – children will receive a special Reading Routes badge, presented in our Celebration Assembly.
- The reading journey does not stop there! When children achieve three Reading Routes badges, their photograph and a book recommendation will be added to our Reading Routes Hall of Fame display, celebrating their achievements and inspiring others with their favourite reads.
- When children achieve five Reading Routes badges, they will be invited to our exclusive lunchtime event, 'Biscuits and Books'. During this special session, children will enjoy a biscuit (or two!) with the Reading Lead while sharing their favourite books and discussing the stories they have loved.



Homework

Year 1-4: Fortnightly - Homework is set on a Monday and due in every other Monday.

Years 5&6: Weekly - Homework is set on a Monday and due in the following Monday. This is to help prepare children for the greater expectations around homework at secondary school.

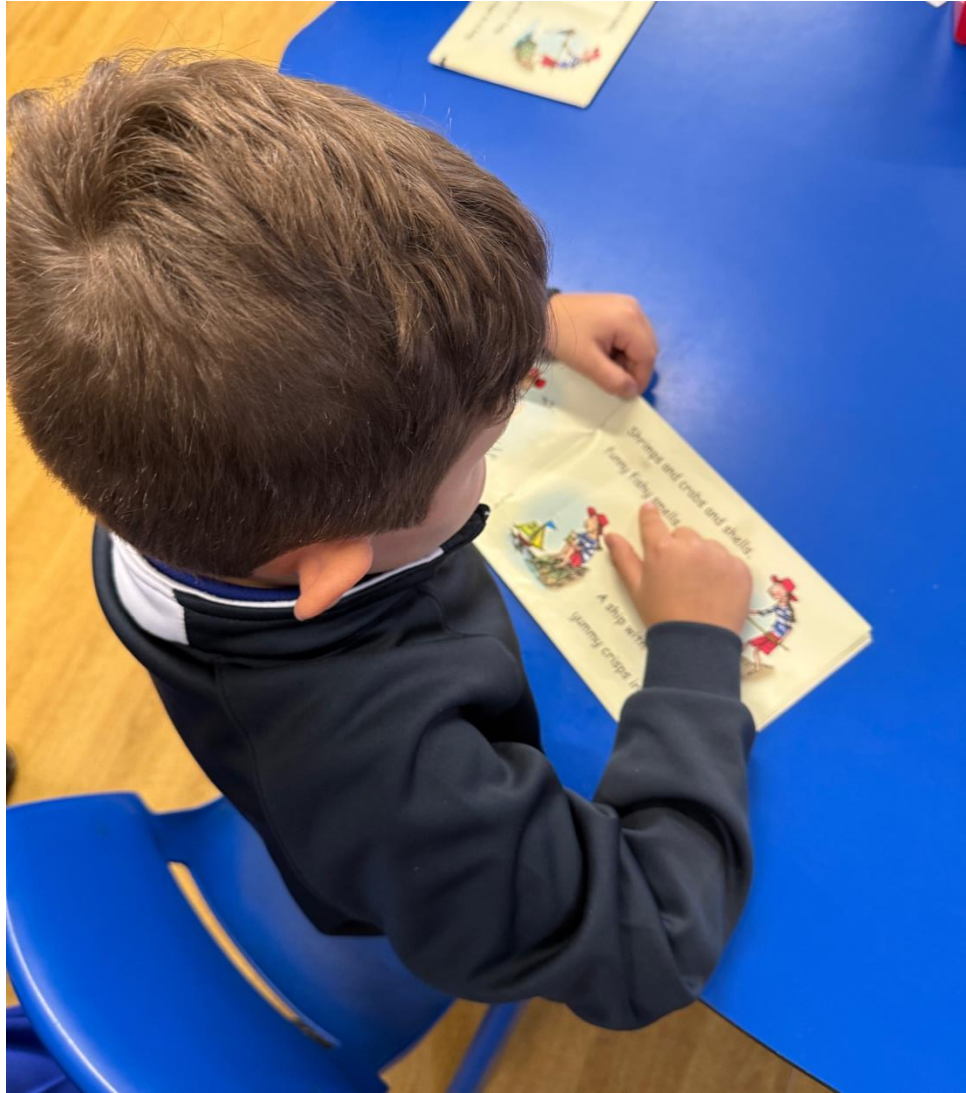
